The Texas State Cemetery is located approximately one mile east of the State Capitol, between 7th and 11th Streets, and serves as the final resting place for notable citizens of Texas.

Culturally, the Cemetery is unique because it represents every aspect of Texas history from European Colonization to modern day Texas politics. Historical and cultural icons are recognized and honored at the Cemetery.

The architecture of the Cemetery was designed to reflect various facets of Texas. The Visitor Center, made of limestone from Sisterdale, Texas, is modeled after the Alamo's long barracks and the granary at Mission San Jose. The Columbarium Wall was built from the same Sunset Red granite as the Capitol.

## **Cemetery Rules:**

Rubbings are prohibited due to the newly restored headstones and monuments. Food and drinks are prohibited on the Cemetery grounds at any time. Pets are not allowed on the Cemetery grounds at any time; however, service animals may accompany their owners. Funerals take precedence over tours. Tours may be canceled in the event of a funeral. We hope visitors will understand the priority of a funeral in this situation.
